A call, a dinner, and a few emails: a true long-distance love story:

A few years ago, I received a phone call from a friend from my Medical School Christian Fellowship days. He invited me to a dinner party to meet a doctor who was working in ophthalmology in Africa and was visiting HK. As an eye doctor, of course I had to go see what that was all about!

At the dinner, as I heard about the needs of the patients, the Samoutous' desire to share the love and good news of Jesus, and the meaningful work of New Sight, I remembered how I too went into medicine to help and share the Gospel, but because of the demands from work and family, those desires had grown cold. As Joyce shared, I suddenly had a wake-up call from God. I thought: I must do something to help!

I started to pray, and sent a few e-mails. In fact, I did not expect any great result. But by God's grace, the HK Association of Private Eye Surgeons contacted its members and several eye institutions, and we received a tremendous response! HK really has some very kind-hearted doctors. I kept receiving offers of help-from all sorts of ophthalmic instruments to glasses and other supplies. We even received an ophthalmic microscope that was worth several thousand dollars! Through this, I thoroughly experienced the incredible power of God. I did not have much faith; all I did was send a few emails, and yet the results were so amazing! I was totally overjoyed. I grew in my confidence to serve through this ministry.

Within a short time, with the help of several brothers and sisters in Christ, we carefully collected and packed several heavy boxes of delicate equipment and supplies. The logistics such as transport and customs clearance were very complicated and challenging. But everything smoothly and safely made it all the way to Congo, which must have been God's care.
